

For centuries, the Pearl River Delta has been at the heart of Western interactions with China, including French concessions in Canton/Guangzhou, the Opium Wars, British and Portuguese colonial outposts and now cell phone and sneaker factories. The clash of cultures has led to the development of some of the most exciting and complex cities in the world, most notably Hong Kong, the center of this study abroad experience. Participants will explore the very old and the very new and see first hand the rise of the second most powerful economy in the world.

- Explore old walled villages and some of the most densely populated parts of the globe
- Contrast Buddhist temples and colonial churches
- Visit shoe factories, financial centers and casinos
- Learn about the culture of tea
